Insurance plays a critical role in offsetting climate change risk and fostering sustainable economic growth. Yet there is limited data and business case examples on climate risk insurance targeting vulnerable populations. To help address this dearth of existing examples, the MicroInsurance Centre at Milliman (MIC@M) embarked on a research project, developing climate risk insurance case studies. This session will briefly introduce microinsurance and do a deep dive into the case study of Sanasa in Sri Lanka.
